little information on how young people interact with this content

- 1** To understand how teenagers use, interact with, and make sense of spaces in the manosphere based on their experiences and interests.
- 2** To map the Spanish manosphere, including its spaces, platforms, communication models, and the actors involved, as well as the content, environments, and motivations for interacting with it.

method



‘Transmedia & LGBTI Literacy’ (TRANSGELIT)

Research project on how young people experience and learn about gender and sexuality through the media, with the aim of creating educational materials.

Short-term ethnography (Pink & Morgan, 2013) —————→ *useful on educational centres*
+ **Participatory Action Research**

3 educational centres from Barcelona, Catalonia

N=59 participants from 14-18 years old —————→

In this specific study, we worked exclusively with data from participants who identified as male, since during the fieldwork we identified that they are the users who interact with spaces in the manosphere.

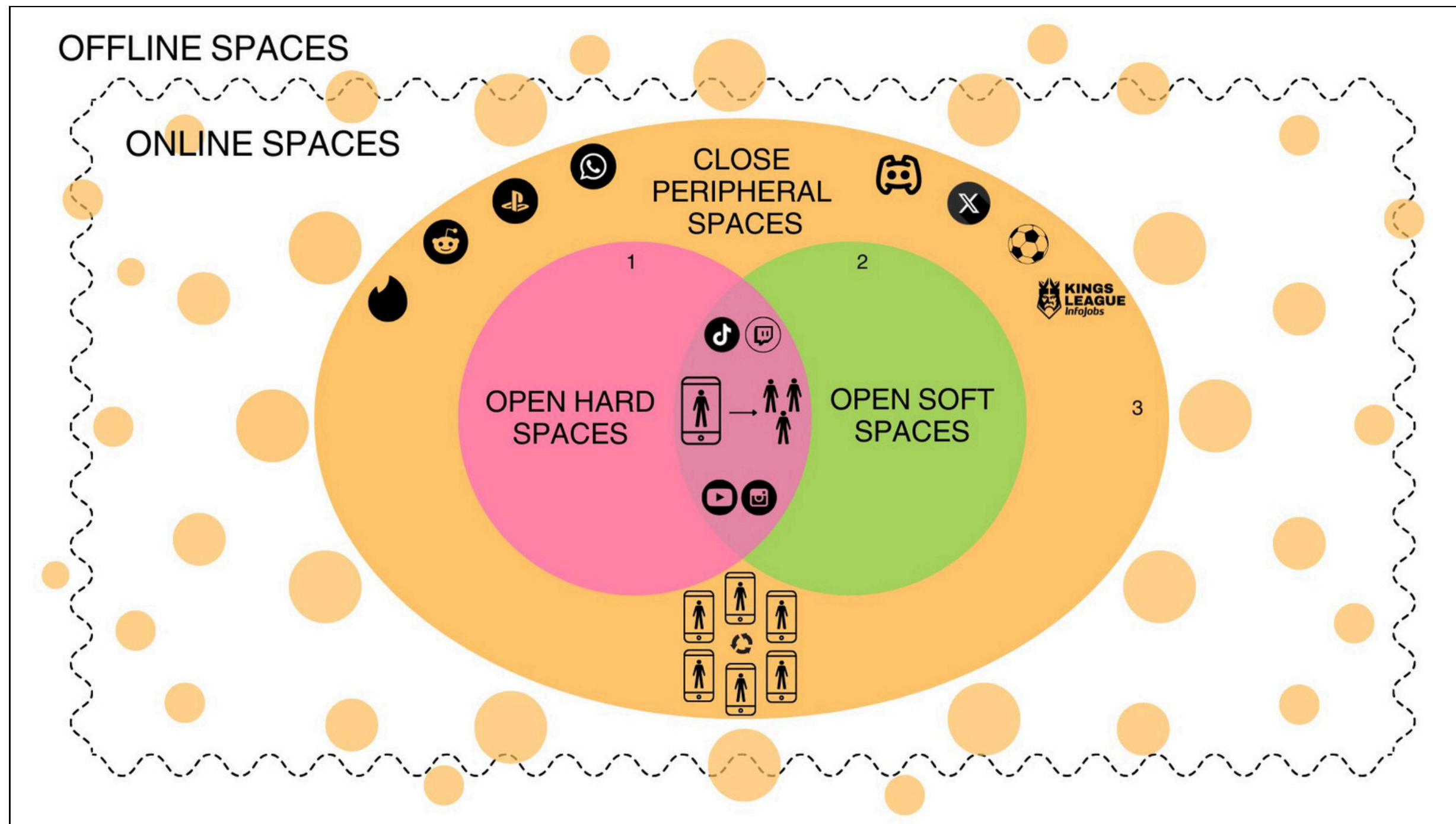

1. **Open Hard Spaces**, which host the central narratives of the manosphere, encapsulating anti-feminist, anti-LGBTIQ+ and reactionary content.
2. **Open Soft Spaces**, where content aligned with the OHS is subtly mixed with dominant or traditionally masculine themes, such as sports, fitness, money making or videogames.
3. **Close Peripheral Spaces**, characterised by intimate interactions between male peers. These spaces connect the online and offline worlds.

Influencers who popularise anti-feminist and anti-LGBTIQ+ discourses among young people

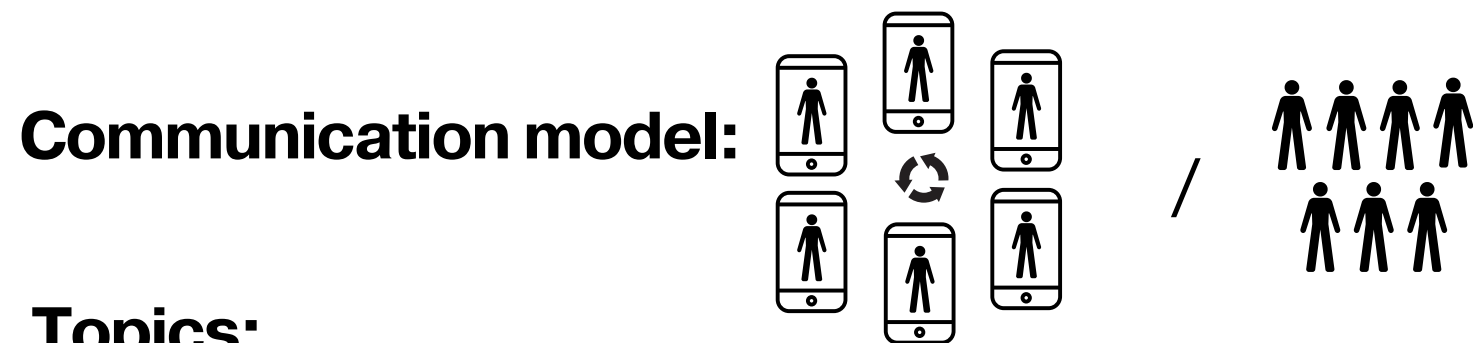

'Close Peripheral Spaces' (CPS)

Peer relationships and homosociality that fluctuates between online and offline

Platforms: Discord, WhatsApp, Instagram, X, Tinder, Omegle, Play Station

Mainstream pornography; sexual and erotic content (memes, stickers of nudes from known people, sexual violence); contents extracted from the OHS and OSS.

Environments:

Rape culture; male gaze; sexpreading; heteronormativity; victim blaming; LGBTIQ+phobia; racism; social experimentation

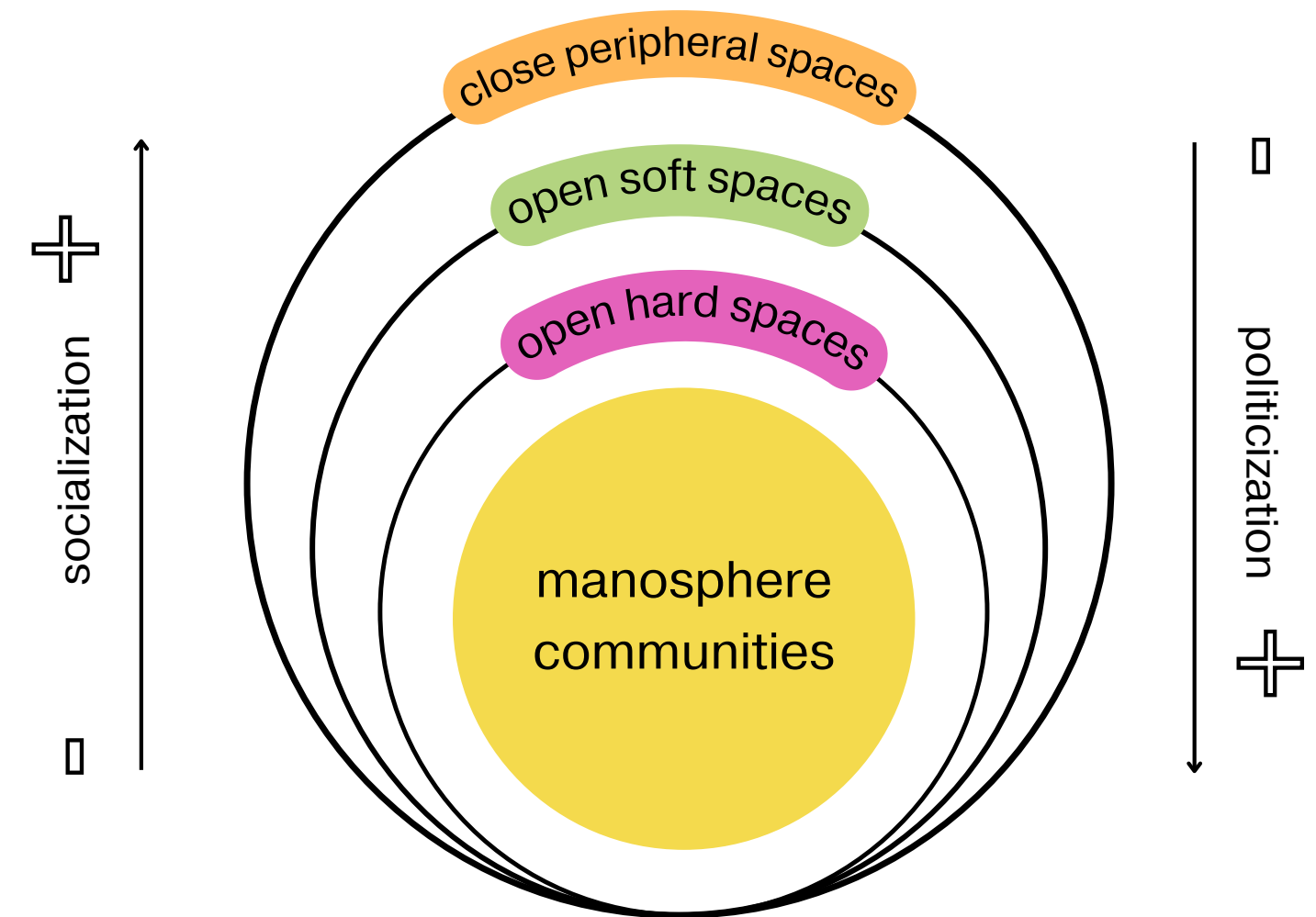

‘the study of communication processes is the study, not of elements, but of elements in relationships’

(Postman, 1974: 4)

- These three spaces are interconnected, creating a fluid ecosystem where misogynistic and anti-LGBTIQ+ discourses can spread.
- What’s dangerous is not just the radical content, but the way it is wrapped in humour, self-help, aspiration, and bro culture.
- Most importantly: boys don’t necessarily identify with these spaces as political. For them, it’s about having fun, bonding, “being a man”. That’s where the power lies.



If you ask a teenager whether he follows manosphere content, he'll probably say **no. But if you ask who he listens to on Twitch, who he jokes with in the WhatsApp group, or who taught him how to talk to girls... **the manosphere is there**. Subtle. Powerful.**

And shaping the next generation of men.
